In addition to the paintings of his "golden period", it was especially the impressive landscape paintings with which the Viennese master Gustav Klimt marked the transition to modern painting. For Gustav Klimt, landscapes which he painted in nature, without preliminary sketches, were a source of tranquillity and meditation. At the centre of his large-scale garden landscapes is the spectacle of nature as an elementary symbol of life.

"Rose Bushes under Trees": a magnificent orchard in which roses bloom, the queen of flowers. Lush apple trees, full of fruit - the orchard as a mythological symbol of paradisiacal fertility. A place of peace and relaxation where life blossoms.
