Bouquets first appeared in Chagall's life around 1909, when he met his future wife, Bella. "It was Bella who brought me the first flower ..."

In his work, the painter depicted flowers the way he found them - often already arranged in a vase. They were not flowers in their natural environment; they were collected and brought to his home and studio. He admired and embraced them before depicting them in his paintings as if he wanted to give expression to his imagination and inner world.

Like the angel, the acrobat or the self-portrait, the bouquet in Chagall's paintings became the expression of an iconographic element that also lifts us into a spiritual realm and symbolises, among other things, the sacred sacrifice. The presence of flowers evokes the eternal search for perfection and leads us into a world marked by excellence and beauty, the sight of which never ceases to find our admiration.
