Max Pechstein (1881-1955), who joined the artist's group "Brücke" in 1906, was soon perceived by the public as its most outstanding member - in fact, as its leading expressionist. He was also its most successful member, which, beyond his artistic development, also led to a break: in 1912, he joined the Berlin Secession - an open affront to the painters of the "Brücke".

The "House on the Curonian Spit" originates from Pechstein's Brücke period. However, in terms of motifs, it also points far ahead into his biography as a painter. Because he painted it during his very first of many visits to the art colony of Nidden on the Curonian Spit. There he devoted himself to maritime motifs and landscapes regularly.
