Max Pechstein created his most important landscape paintings at the Baltic Sea. Over the decades, Max Pechstein repeatedly travelled there. For instance, he travelled six times to the so-called Curonian Spit, a sand-dune spit that separates the Curonian Lagoon from the Baltic Sea coast, where he lived and worked for weeks and months as a member of the Nidden artists' group. In 1921, he discovered the landscape around the small town of Leba with its eponymous "city river" in the former Kashubia (today the Pomeranian Voivodeship) not far from Gdansk.
