It is the time right before the birth of the abstract in art. Wassily Kandinsky originated from Russian folk art, Impressionism, Fauvism. In the summer months until 1914, he and his partner, the painter Gabriele Münter, swapped the Munich metropolis for their domicile in Murnau in Upper Bavaria. There they deepened their Expressionist style. Soon Kandinsky shifted away from landscape painting towards pure compositions of colour and form.
