This torso from the MMA, New York, is one of the most beautiful preserved statues of the gods of antiquity. It probably shows Faunus, who was dedicated a temple on the Tiber Island together with Jupiter, the father of the gods, as early as 194 BC. As one of the oldest figures in mythology, he represents free and indomitable nature. Images of him are rare: Faunus is the spontaneous, unpredictable voice of the divine. Like his Greek model Pan, he protects the cattle and the fields; as an ancient Latin god, he is also regarded as prophesying. Our authentic polymer ars mundi museum replica, hand-cast from weatherproof artificial marble on a black diabase base, is made to add mythical charm to your conservatory...
