In 1793, there was an unusual double wedding. The 18-year-old Princess Luise of Mecklenburg-Strelitz married the Crown Prince of Prussia, Frederick William III, and the 16-year-old Friederike married his younger brother Louis. This event was why Johann Gottfried Schadow created this graceful sculpture of the two sisters. The marble group of Prussian princesses, the first life-size double statue of classicism, is the most graceful example of Schadow's style, which was both classically ideal and true-to-life and set the trend for the 19th century.
