Bouquets first appeared in Chagall's life around 1909, when he met his future wife Bella. "It was Bella who brought me the first flower ..."

The painter depicted flowers the way he found them - often already grouped and arranged in a vase. They were not flowers in their natural environment; they were collected and brought to his home and studio. He admired them, even embraced them before depicting them through painting, almost as if he wanted to give expression to his imagination and inner world.

Like the angel, the acrobat or the self-portrait, the bouquet in Chagall's paintings became the expression of an iconographic element that lifts us into a spiritual realm and symbolises, among other things, the sacred sacrifice. The presence of flowers evokes the eternal quest for perfection and leads us into a world of excellence and beauty, the sight of which never ceases to find our admiration.
