August Macke (1887-1914) was a pioneer of the avant-garde in Germany at the beginning of the 20th century and a member of the artist group "Blauer Reiter". In 1913, Macke moved with his family to Oberhofen on Lake Thun in Switzerland. In 1914 he created this view of the castle park in the village. Macke captured the atmosphere of this magnificent garden in his unique imagery with strong and bright colours.
