



## Gustav Klimt: Picture "Malcesine on Lake Garda" (1913), framed

The Austrian painter Gustav Klimt discovered landscape painting in his later work. In 1913, one of his numerous journeys took Klimt to Lake Garda in Italy. Here he created this view of the town of Malcesine with its densely packed houses and a small harbour.

As in many of his landscape paintings, Klimt stuck to a square size. This picture format also meant that he only depicted the walls and the lower part of the tower of a castle, which has a decisive influence on the townscape. The painter would actually have had to be on a boat in order to depict this perspective. However, since it is known that Klimt often used a telescope for his landscape observations, it is also possible that he was looking at Malcesine from a great distance.
